At the February meeting we welcome any information learned at any other seminars.


This month's Beekeeping To-Do List includes cleaning and culling old frames and foundation, painting boxes, building new equipment, making sure your bees have food, clearing entrances of hives to ensure good airflow and learning something new such as queen rearing, candle-making, soap making, collecting pollen or producing comb honey.

Now is also a great time to learn about the different chemicals for treating varroa mites, especially new oxalic acid method, or IPM (Integrated Pest Management) that is a non-chemical way of dealing with mites.

<u>New Beekeepers -- Eligibility to Receive a Complimentary Apiary</u> <u>Diagnostic Kit</u>

The USDA Specialty Crop Block Grant allows OSBA to provide up to 700 complimentary Apiary Diagnostic Kits to new Ohio beekeepers to help increase their monitoring skills. Eligibility requirements for new Ohio beekeeper: Have taken a 2016 or 2017 beginner beekeeping class (if we have the class list from your instructor) or proof of class Proof of Apiary Registration Proof of Equipment Purchase Commitment to fill out short on-line monthly surveys throughout 2016/2017 regarding your hive visits If you meet those prerequisites, then visit www.ohiostatebeekeepers.org/adk to get information on how to apply for your complimentary kit. New beekeepers who sign up for the program will receive monthly reminders of apiary tasks to help keep them on track for a successful year. Kits will be sent out after March 15, 2017. Monthly Honey Recipe:

Honey Passion Fruit Blueberry Cupcakes

2 cups - unbleached all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon - baking soda
1/2 teaspoon - baking powder
1/2 teaspoon - salt
3/4 cup - passion fruit nectar
1/4 cup - buttermilk
1/2 cup - butter, softened
1/2 cup - Wildflower honey, or other mild-flavored honey
2 large - eggs
1 cup (4 oz.) - fresh blueberries

Directions

Preheat oven to 350° F. Sift together flour, baking soda, baking powder and salt; set aside. In a liquid measure, combine passion fruit nectar and buttermilk; set aside. In a mixing bowl, cream butter until fluffy. Add honey; mix well. Add eggs, one at a time. Add half of the reserved dry ingredients to the butter mixture; mix on low until just combined. With mixer running on low, slowly add the passion fruit mixture. Add remaining dry ingredients until just combined. Gently fold in blueberries. Fill paper-lined muffin tins 2/3 full. Bake 18-22 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in center of a muffin comes out clean. Remove to wire rack; cool. Frost with Honey Passion Fruit Whipped Cream (below), if desired.
