


Dog Paw Balm

Something fun to do with our beeswax,

Gifts, and fair basket. It is suggested to keep fur
trimmed off bottom of paws to prevent those ice
balls, which can lead to chapping.

And chaffing, even cuts. It's also suggested to wipe paws off when coming in from winter weather, due to snow, ice, and de-icing products, which can burn pads and sensitive skin that's between their toes. We're not doctors, do your own research. Check with your veterinarian. This recipe is suggested as a preventative idea.




- 2 Tablespoons Beeswax
- 2 Tablespoons Shea Butter
- 2 Tablespoons Coconut Oil
- 2 Tablespoon Olive Oil
- 20 Drops Food Grade Lavender Essential Oil

Toothpick

4 Ounce Mason Jar with Lid

Small Glass Microwavable Bowl

Directions:

Microwave beeswax, shea butter, coconut oil and olive oil in glass bowl for about 1 minute.

Use toothpick to stir until completely melted.

Add lavender oil and stir with the toothpick.

Pour mixture into mason jar.

Allow to cool and solidify.

Put lid on.

Decorate jar top as desired and label.
