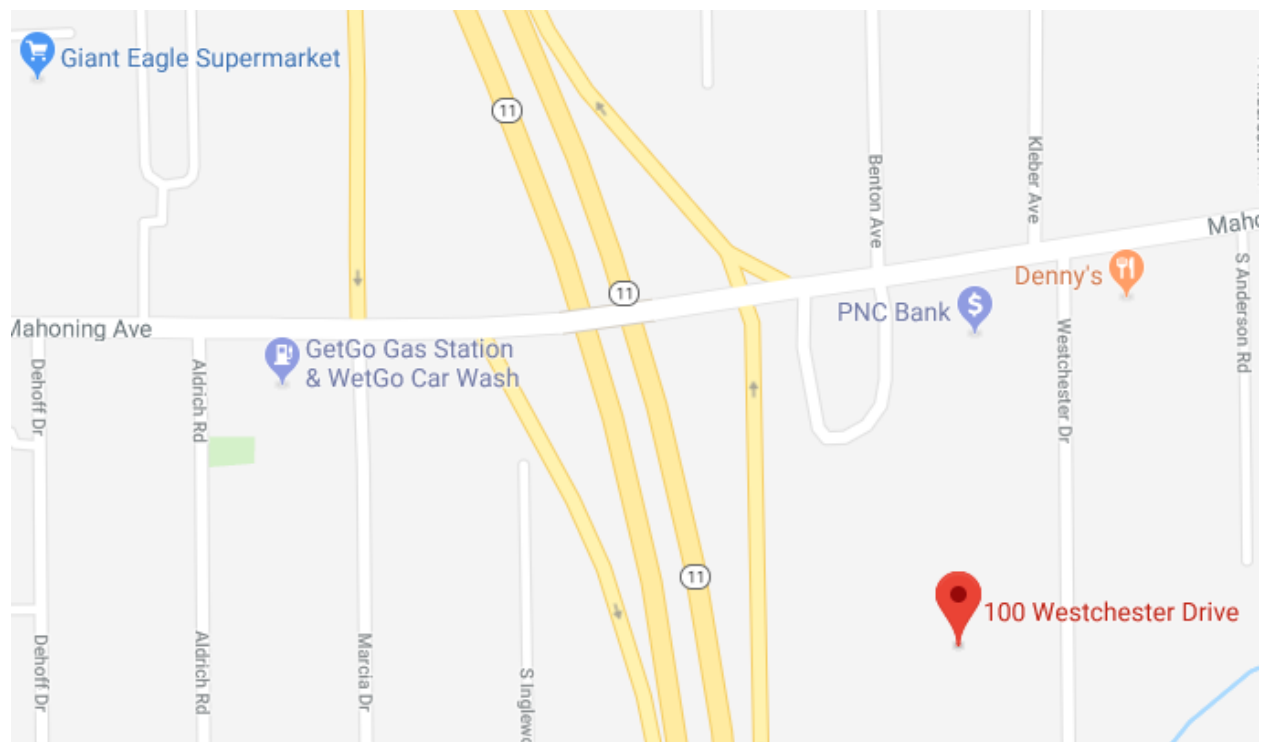

Happen in the Hive:

August:

- Check for queen cells and brood diseases.
- Add supers for fall flow.
- Requeen if honey flow is on.
- Provide shade and water.

September:

- Provide more supers as needed.
- Check for brood disease.
- Requeen failing colonies.
- Remove excess honey.

Faux Honey Slime Recipe Number 1

Together we have been learning about more ways to share our bee education. Here is another opportunity for us to do so. This also allows sensory engagement while learning about bees.



Ingredients:

1 1/4 cup Water (1 cup hot - 1/4 cup room temp)
1/3 teaspoon borax
5 oz clear glue
1 tube food coloring yellow gel
1 pkg gold glitter extra fine (optional)
1 pkg small bees (optional)
2 small bowls
Something to stir with
Paper towels
Container for storage

***This is for sensory play - it is not edible - not for human consumption.**

Directions:

1. Add 1 cup of hot water and the borax to a small bowl and stir well.
2. Pour the glue into a small bowl and add 1/4 cup of room temperature water. Stir gently but firmly until well mixed.
3. Add your food coloring to the glue mixture.
*Gel food coloring works well. I use 5 drops of yellow.
Then mix a bit of red and green to make a brown and added only a small bit of that trying to achieve a perfect honey color. Stir well.
4. To this colored glue mixture - extra fine glitter can be added - it really makes the honey slime colors pop.
- * Use extra fine glitter to avoid a scratchy feeling and you only need a little. I add 1/2 tsp of gold and 1/2 tsp of dark gold.
5. If you wish to really go for the bee theme - now is the time to add your small plastic bees, bee buttons or gold sequins (etc) to your glue mixture - stir them in.
6. Pour this glue mixture into the bowl with water mixture or borax solution. Let sit for 30 seconds. You will see the mixture start to form a clump or form a glob.
7. After 30 seconds, use your hand to grab the honey slime and put it into an empty bowl. Knead it for a few seconds.
* It may feel sticky as first, if it still feels sticky after a minute of kneading - add a small amount of the borax and water to it.
8. Once it reaches the consistency you like- it is time to put it in a jar with a tight lid. Clean up any drips, spills etc right away.

Honey Slime Recipe Number 2

This honey slime recipe is made with honey. Another sensory engagement. Can be used also in your fair basket. Two fun slime recipes this month, both with different ideas, all related to incorporating learning ideas about the honeybee.



Ingredients:

- ½ cup honey
- 1 cup cornstarch (powdered sugar can also be used but may require more than 1 cup)
- 3 to 5 tablespoons oil (I used vegetable oil)

Directions:

In a microwave safe container, mix together the cornstarch and honey by pressing with the back of a spoon. Mix as much of the cornstarch into the honey as you can.

Place the mixture into the microwave for 15 to 30 seconds or just until warmed.

To the honey mixture, add 1 tablespoon of oil at a time until it forms a dough.

Turn the dough out onto parchment or waxed paper. Knead (and smooth) oil into the dough until it reaches a stretchy, slime-like consistency.

If the honey slime becomes sticky or stiff while playing, add a little more oil.

Store in an airtight container at room temperature. If refrigerated, the slime will become stiff. Bring to room temperature before playing.
