

She has also strengthened her relationship with her grandfather by working the hives with him.

This Month/Next Month in Beekeeping:

January

The bees are in a tight cluster in the hive and should only come out when the temperature rises about 40°F. Monitor your hives to make sure they have not been disturbed by winter weather or overly inquisitive animals. On days warmer than 50°F you can open the hive to feed the bees. Dry sugar and winter pollen patties are the preferred fare. Cut the pollen patties the width of the frame so they do not span over multiple frames. This will keep moisture from condensing on them and raining down on the bees. They can handle the cold when they are dry but they can't when they are wet. Remember to order packages and nucs for the 2019 season.

February

The cluster is slowing making its way up the hive. Continue feeding the bees as this is a critical time for them. If they did not have enough stores they will starve. Now is a good time to start working on your equipment doing repairs, cleaning and disinfecting dead outs and assembling new items.

Monthly Honey Recipe:

Honey Garlic Crockpot Meatballs

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 1/3 cup honey
- 1/2 cup ketchup
- 2 TB soy sauce
- 3 cloves garlic minced
- 1 28oz bag fully cooked, frozen meatballs

Directions

- In a medium bowl, mix together brown sugar, honey, ketchup, soy sauce and garlic.
- Place frozen meatballs in a 3-4 quart crockpot and pour sauce over meatballs.
 Stir so all meatballs are coated evenly.
 Cook on LOW for 4 hours, stirring occasionally.
